VIII CONSTITUTIONAL GOVERNMENT

Law n.º___/2022, of ___ of ___ STATE GENERAL BUDGET FOR 2023

The General State Budget for 2023 presents, in accordance with article 145 of the Constitution of the Republic, the revenues and expenses of the services and entities of the Public Administrative Sector for the budget year 2023.

The Annex to this law presents the budgetary tables of the revenues and expenses of the Administrative Public Sector.

The revenues of the Administrative Public Sector amount to \$3,156,922,141, while the expenses of the Administrative Public Sector amount to \$3,155,715,306.

The revenues of the Central Government sub-sector amount to \$2,800,000,000 and the expenses amount to \$2,800,000,000.

Revenues for the Social Security sub-sector amount to \$235,715,306 and expenditures amount to \$235,715,306.

Revenues from the Oe-Cusse Ambeno Special Administrative Region subsector amount to \$121,206,835 and expenditures amount to \$120,000,000.

The Government presents to the National Parliament, under section 97.1(c) and 145.1 of the Constitution of the Republic, the following draft law:

CHAPTER I INITIAL PROVISIONS

Article 1 Object and scope

The State Budget presents the budgetary forecasts for the services and entities of the Public Administrative Sector, and is composed of the Central Administration Budget, the Social Security Budget, and the Budget of the Special Administrative Region of Oe-Cusse Ambeno.

CHAPTER II GENERAL STATE BUDGET

Article 2 Approval of the Budgetary Tables

The General State Budget for 2023 is hereby approved, as set forth in the following tables:

- a) Table I of the Annex to the present law, being an integral part thereof, with the revenue of the Public Administrative Sector, by subsectors;
- b) Table II of the Annex to this law, which is an integral part thereof, with the expenditure of the Public Administrative Sector, by subsectors;
- c) Table III of the Annex to this law, which is an integral part thereof, with the expenditure of the Public Administrative Sector, by functional classification;
- d) Table IV of the Annex to this law, which is an integral part thereof, with the revenue of the Central Government sub-sector, by economic classification;
- e) Table V of the Annex to this law, which is an integral part thereof, with the expenditure of the Central Government sub-sector, by organic classification and structured by programs;

- f) Table VI of the Annex to this law, which is an integral part thereof, with the Central Government sub-sector's expenditure by economic classification;
- g) Table VII of the Annex to this law, which is an integral part thereof, with the revenue of the Social Security sub-sector, by economic classification, total and by regime and administration:
- h) Table VIII of the Annex to this law, which is an integral part thereof, with the expenses of the Social Security sub-sector by organic classification and structured by programs;
- i) Table IX of the Annex to this law, which is an integral part thereof, with the Social Security sub-sector's expenditure by economic classification, total and by regime and administration;
- j) Table X of the Annex to this law, which forms an integral part thereof, with the revenue of the subsector of the Special Administrative Region of Oe-Cusse Ambeno, by economic classification;
- k) Table XI of the Annex to this law, which forms an integral part thereof, with the expenditure of the subsector of the Special Administrative Region of Oe-Cusse Ambeno, by organic classification and structured by programs;
- Table XII of the Annex to this law, which is an integral part thereof, with the expenditure of the subsector of the Special Administrative Region of Oe-Cusse Ambeno, by economic classification.

Article 3 Taxes, fees and contributions

- 1. During the year 2023, the Government and the services and entities of the Central Administration are authorized to collect the taxes and fees set forth in the legislation in force.
- 2. During the year 2023, the National Institute of Social Security shall be authorized to collect the contributions due to Social Security set forth in the legislation in force, as well as to withhold at source and deliver to the Tax Administration the taxes due regarding the benefits paid to the beneficiaries.
- 3. During the year 2023, the Authority of the Special Administrative Region of Oe-Cusse Ambeno is hereby authorized to collect the taxes and fees contained in the legislation in force.
- 4. The following shall be exempt from the payment of taxes, fees, customs duties and other levies, as well as from withholding taxes
 - a) The acquisition, by the State or other public legal persons, of arms and ammunition for the National Police of Timor-Leste (PNTL), the Scientific Police for Criminal Investigation (PCIC) and the FALINTIL - Defense Forces of Timor-Leste;
 - b) The payments to be made on account of expenses related to medical assistance abroad;
 - c) The introduction, in the national territory, of goods that are donated, or used in the production or construction of goods that are donated, to the State by foreign States, by public collective persons of foreign States or by international organizations.
 - d) The income of cooperation agents of foreign States, of public collective persons of foreign States or of international organizations that carry out their activities under agreements entered into with the State.
- 5. During the year 2023, the excise tax rate applicable:
 - a) To sugars and confectionery products, tariff headings 1701, 1702, 1703 and 1704, shall be \$1.00 per kilogram;
 - b) To waters, including mineral waters and aerated waters, containing added sugar or other sweetening matter or flavored, and other non-alcoholic beverages, except fruit or vegetable juices of heading 20.09, tariff item 2202, is US \$3.00 per liter;

- c) Malt beer with an alcohol content of less than 4.5%, tariff heading 2203.00.10, is US \$2.70 per liter,
- d) Malt beer with other alcohol content, tariff item 2203.00.20, is US \$4.50 per liter;
- e) To wine, vermouth and other fermented beverages, tariff headings 2204, 2205 and 2206, is US \$4.50 per liter;
- f) On tobacco, tariff lines 2401, 2402 and 2403, it is \$100.00 per kilogram;
- g) To passenger cars, tariff heading 8703, is 10% of the value exceeding \$10,000, 20% of the value exceeding \$25,000 and 30% of the value exceeding \$50,000;
- h) The captive bolt guns for slaughtering animals, tariff heading 9303.90.00, is 10% of the value.
- 6. During the year 2023, the rate of import customs duty is 5% of the customs value of the goods.
- 7. During the year 2023, the social security contribution rate is 10%, distributed as follows:
 - a) 6 % is the responsibility of the employer;
 - b) 4% is the employee's responsibility.
- 8. Notwithstanding the provisions of the previous number, employers in the private sector may benefit, in accordance with the law, from reductions and exemptions in the portion of the contribution rate to be borne by them, for transitional periods, with a view to supporting and encouraging adherence to the Contributory Social Security Scheme.

Article 4 Transfers from the Petroleum Fund

- 1. During the year 2023, the Government is authorized to make transfers from the Petroleum Fund up to the amount of \$1,346,090,000.
- 2. The transfers authorized by the preceding number shall be made after compliance with the provisions of Article 8 of the Petroleum Fund Law, in respect of the amount up to \$490,146,398, corresponding to the Estimated Sustainable Income.
- 3. The transfers authorized by paragraph 1 are made after compliance with subparagraphs a), b), c) and d) of Article 9.1 of the same law, and when the balance of the Treasury account is less than \$200,000,000, for the amount above the amount referred to in the preceding paragraph.
- 4. The transfers from the Petroleum Fund provided for in the preceding paragraph shall be notified by the Government to the National Parliament at least ten days in advance.

Article 5 Public Debt

During the year 2023, the Government is authorized to contract or issue public debt in the maximum amount of \$200,000,000, with a maximum term of 40 years.

Article 6 Transfers between sub-sectors

A transfer is made from the State to the Social Security Budget in the amount of \$67,860,306, to finance expenses with the Non-contributory and Transitional Regimes and with the Social Security System Administration, entered as expenditure in the Central Administration Budget, under the category "Current Transfers", item "Transfers to the Public Administrative Sector", under the heading "General State Appropriation", "Program 980: Gender Equality and Social Inclusion" and as revenue in the Social Security Budget, in the category "Current Transfers", heading "Transfers to the Public Administrative Sector", being executed according to the various categories of economic classification of expenditure of the Social Security Budget, contained in Table IX of the Annex.

CHAPTER III SOCIAL SECURITY BUDGET

Article 7 Transfer of the Social Security Budget Balance

The Social Security budget balance from the previous fiscal year shall be transferred to the Social Security Reserve Fund.

CHAPTER IV FINAL PROVISIONS

Article 8 Organic changes

The Government is also authorized, through the member of the Government responsible for the area of finance, to make budgetary alterations arising from organic changes in the structure of the Public Administrative Sector, with respect for the total value of the expenditure in the State Budget and in each of the sub-sectors.

Article 9 Parliamentary control

The National Parliament shall hold a quarterly debate on the budget execution of the services and entities of the Central Administration, Social Security and the Special Administrative Region of Oe-Cusse Ambeno, in the presence of the respective members of the Government and top management bodies, based on the quarterly budget execution reports and the quarterly performance reports for each of the four quarters.

Article 10 Entry into force and effects

This law shall come into effect on the day after it is published, and shall be effective as of 1 January 2023.
