This award is in keeping with the strategy implemented by Bolloré Transport Logistics, which wants to develop its various areas of expertise in markets where the Group already operates.

Knowledge of the logistics market in Timor-Leste, where the Group has been expanding mits operations for the past 16 years, enabled it to draw up the best bid. Accordingly, Bolloré Ports will build and operate the Dili Deepwater Port as part of a public-private partnership with the Timor-Leste Government Authorities.

This ambitious project provides for the construction of a 630 metre-long and 15-metre-deep wharf, and of a landside area covering 24 hectares.

This port platform, which will be compliant with international standards, will be equipped with cutting-edge container handling and general cargo equipment, which will specifically enable the handling of container ships with a capacity of over 7.500 TEU
