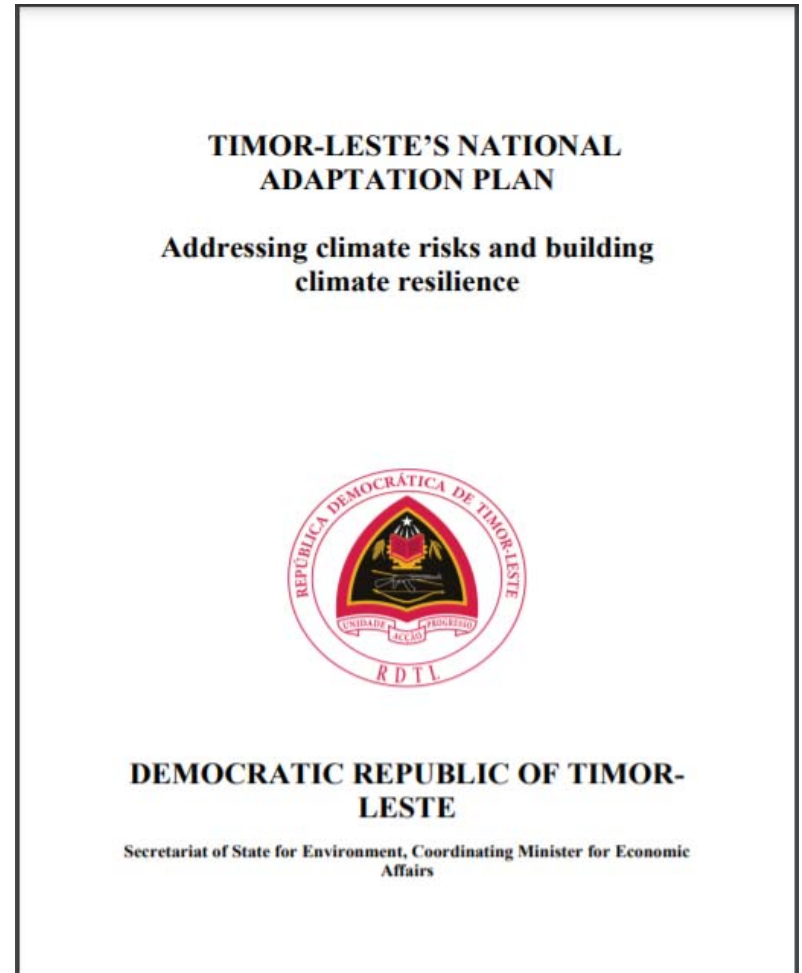

I. Brief introduction of NAP Timor-Leste

- NAP was formulated in December 2020 and submitted it to the UNFCCC Secretariat on 31 March 2021;
- Vision: to build a climate-resilient development trajectory for the country and its people;
- Objective: reduce vulnerability and integrate climate change adaptation into sectoral policies, programs, and plans





2. NAP key priorities

NAP of Timor-Leste has 6 programs as follow:

1. Institutional capacity building
2. Addressing the needs of indigenous and vulnerable communities and groups
3. Using ecosystem-based DRR in coastal areas and coral reefs
4. Improving water resources management under climate change
5. Promoting sustainable land management under climate change
6. Building climate-resilient livelihoods

The NAP priority sectors are as follow:

1. Infrastructure adaptation priority program
2. Biodiversity and ecosystem sector
3. Health sector adaptation priority program
4. Agriculture sector adaptation priority program
5. Water sector adaptation program
6. Disaster risk reduction adaptation program
7. Tourism sector adaptation priority program

- Short term from 2020-2022
- Medium term from 2022-2025
- Long term from 2025-2030

4. The immediate next steps in the further implementation of the NAP

- Formalizing institutional arrangement establishing a formal legal mandate and ensuring buy-in and ownership on the part of line agency stakeholders;
- Complete sectoral impact chain analysis and vulnerability/risk assessment;
- Stocktaking of progress and updating prioritized adaptation actions;
- Communication strategy;
- Costing and financing plan;
- Monitoring, Evaluation, and Learning Framework
